Scope

One possibly serious issue in coastal zones affected by climate change is expected to be erosion, which takes place not only at the coast but also in riverside areas. This is an international issue in areas which are vulnerable to climate change. Erosion's severity, its influencing factors, and adaptive techniques and strategies depend upon the circumstances of each objective site. Therefore, knowledge from human and social sciences as well as that from natural sciences is necessary to obtain appropriate solutions. In this sense, erosion is important from the viewpoint of sustainability. On this occasion, due emphasis is placed on finding a methodology for solution of common issues with Vietnam and Japan through exchange of information and knowledge from different organizations related to erosion. Topics at the workshop provisionally include those shown below.

- Mechanisms of erosion
- Prediction and adaptation
- Measurement and investigation
- Numerical simulation and validation



Call for Abstract and Papers

Symposium theme: 'Erosion and Its Adaptation'

Abstracts and Papers are invited for the aforementioned and related topics. Abstracts of proposed papers, which should be submitted by e-mail, are requested to reach the conference secretary **no later than June 30, 2009**. Each abstract should be in English and should be of about 300 words, with a title not exceeding 80 characters and the name, affiliation and e-mail address of the author(s).

We welcome submission of abstracts from all interested persons, although the workshop is planning to host experts from three Universities: Hanoi University of Science, Vietnam, Kyoto University and Ibaraki University, Japan. Notification of paper acceptance will be given by the end of July, 2009. Completed papers shall reach the workshop secretary **no later than August 31, 2009**.

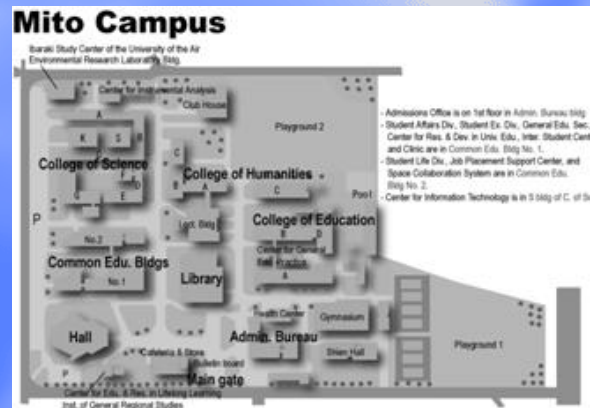
